# A Physician-Scientist Journey in Translational Research on Antimicrobial Resistance

Cesar A. Arias is Professor of Medicine, Microbiology and Molecular Genetics and holds the Margaret and Herbert Dupont Chair in Infectious Diseases at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston. He is the director and founder of the Center of Antimicrobial Resistance and Microbial Genomics (CARMiG) at McGovern Medical School and the director of the Center for Infectious Diseases at the School of Public Health. Dr. Arias earned his MD from Universidad El Bosque, Bogota, Colombia, where he is currently an adjunct professor, and his PhD from the University of Cambridge, United Kingdom. He is an internationally recognized expert on mechanisms of antibiotic resistance with emphasis on Gram-positive organisms, the clinical impact of resistance, and the molecular epidemiology of antibiotic-resistant organisms with > 200 publications in the field.
