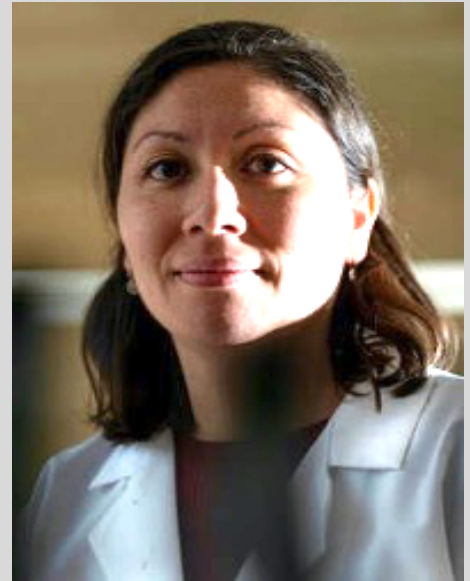

## Seeing is believing: Unraveling the mysteries of embryonic development one experiment at a time

Rosa A. Uribe is Assistant Professor of Biosciences and a Cancer Prevention & Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) Scholar in Cancer Research at Rice University. Dr. Uribe earned her PhD from University of Texas, Austin. She completed a postdoctoral fellowship at California Institute of Technology funded by Burroughs Wellcome Fund and National Institutes of Health NRSA fellowships. Dr. Uribe is an expert on mechanisms of cellular and tissue differentiation during embryonic development, with an emphasis on early nervous system tissues in vertebrates.
